KNITTING FOR BEGINNERS & INTERMEDIATES

The Beginners explore the world of some of the greatest artists in knitting history. No previous experience is necessary. You will learn the basics of knitting: starting from casting on stitches to knit and purl. You can choose to make a double-sided scarf or cap in six weeks. The skills you learn will help you create heirlooms such as bedspreads from designs of your choice. The intermediates can join with their ongoing projects or bring in new ones. You will learn how to read patterns and new stitches if you choose. You will definitely enjoy sharing your techniques with all the others and create your own project at the same time. *Materials needed:* Cap; 2 Skeins; Scarf: 4 Skeins of 3 to 3.5 oz of 4 ply worsted Acrylic or wool yarn of the color of your choice. Knitting tools: A pair of needles as called for by the yarn of your choice (wood needles work better), stitch holder, row counter, stitching needle for yarn, crochet hook, measure tape and a pair of needle point scissors. (Minimum 10 / Maximum 12)
