Approximately 15 members of the community were present.

PRESENTATIONS

Mr. Mike Polansky of the Greater Long Island Runner's Club presented the District with a check for \$1,644 for the Ho Ho Ho Run that was held here in December.

Five high school students, Naoki Rufian, Ailin Yu, Joaane Kim, Megan Hsun and Terrie Hsun spoke to the Board about their experiences with the Composite Prototyping Center in Plainview. Mr. Philip Coniglio coordinated this program. The students learned about this new technology with actual engineers. Each student designed their own piece of composite material. It was a 15-hour course and the students earned one college credit. Everyone was very impressed with the students and the program.

Mrs. Julie Tusa, a parent of a 6th grade student and 1st grade student spoke to the Board about the "Opt-Out" movement. Mrs. Tusa went on to say that she is in awe of the District and the teachers and staff. She is also an educator. Mrs. Tusa wanted to know what the Board's position on the "opt-out" movement is. Mr. Clark stated that we are not a "sit and stare" district and that our teachers do not teach exclusively for the tests. It is the parent's choice to opt-out and the District will respect any decision that the parent makes. If you opt-out of the testing the student is asked to bring a book to read during the test times.

Ann Donnelly, PTA President at Charles Campagne felt that the people may not be completely informed. People are getting information from Facebook, etc. and are not sure what the repercussions are of taking the test or not taking the test.

Mr. Kelly, Board President, thanked everyone for their comments.

Mr. Clark reported that we will be holding off adopting our 2015-2016 Budget until our April 21st Meeting. The budget is phenominal. We are looking at 0% increase on the levy. This is due to decline in pension contributions as well as the Board paying down debt. We have a no-cuts budget and are able to add a district-wide elementary drama program for the students as well as a Director of Technology.
